




[Harimayabashi tram stop - Chikurin-ji Temple (Walking section: 2.5km)]






















Climbing the mountain path that leads up from here.




Garden. Note that all areas other than the pilgrimage route are toll areas. Please follow the route indicated on the signs.

Brief History of Chikurin-ji Temple

Chikurin-ji Temple was founded in 724 by the monk Gyoki at the request of Emperor Shomu. One night, the emperor dreamt that he had been taught the true essence of Buddhism from the bodhisattva Monjushuri at Mt. Godai in China, famed as the sacred location of the Monju Bosatsu (Buddha of wisdom). He then ordered Gyoki to find a sacred place in Japan similar to Mt. Godai and build a Buddhist temple. It is said that this place was soon selected, and Chikurin-ji was founded, with its principal image the statue of the bodhisattva Monjushuri carved by Gyoki himself.
