

























































Iwamoto-ji Temple (岩本寺)

Brief History of Iwamoto-ji Temple

The predecessor to this temple was built by the monk Gyoki in the Tenpyo era (729-749). Kukai later visited the area in the early 9th century and built 5 shrines and 5 temples. Eventually the principal image of each temple was gathered in what is now Iwamoto-ji. This temple has 575 paintings gathered from all over the country displayed on the ceiling of its main hall. The art varies wildly in style from Western paintings to Japanese chigiri-e collages. Motifs are also diverse, ranging from the Buddha to Marilyn Monroe.
